STATEMENT	<p>Jeopardizing the safety of students on a bus or in a taxi will not be tolerated.</p> <p>An offence is constituted by a written “Bus Behaviour Report” submitted by a driver to a Principal.</p> <p>The Principal shall notify parents by phone and in writing of all reported incidents.</p>	
PROCEDURE	<p>1. The bus/taxi driver is responsible for the safety of students on the bus/taxi. The Principal is to give assistance to the driver and will determine consequences of misbehaviour and the reinstatement of transportation service for the offending students. Consequences are at the sole discretion of the Principal who will consider the following mitigating factors for each student:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) 1st offence – The Principal shall provide a warning or suspend transportation privileges for a period of up to three (3) school days. Parents shall be notified. b) 2nd offence – The Principal shall suspend transportation privileges for a period of up to five (5) school days. Parents shall be notified. c) 3rd offence – The Principal shall suspend transportation privileges for a minimum of five (5) school days up to the balance of the school year. Parents shall be notified. 	

	<p>2. Any subsequent offence shall result in the loss of bus/taxi privileges for the remainder of the school year.</p>
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
